## *Neighborhood Improvement Matching Grants 2006*

The Neighborhood Improvement Matching Grants Program awards grants up to \$5,000 to neighborhood-serving or neighborhood-based organizations and individuals to initiate projects designed to benefit your neighborhood. All recipient groups must be enrolled with our *Neighborhood Association Registry*. Projects can be physical or social in nature, but must emphasize neighborhood input and involvement and be able to demonstrate how the project will benefit the neighborhood. Let's do it! **An Open Letter and Call to Action for all the  
Good Citizens of the Honorable, Prestigious, and Distinctive  
Municipality of Raleigh, NC**
